Our definition of Inclusive Publishing:

The methodology and practice of creating a single, typically commercial publication which can be accessed by everyone irrespective of print disability, using mainstream or specialist assistive technology.

Focus on the content creation process: accessibility, validation and adherence to standards within.

A community snapshot asking the question:

"Are we adopting best practice?"



EPUB Accessibility 1.0

- Important specification for the accessibility publishing community
- EPUB 3 for content creation
- 62% of publishers surveyed are adhering to the EPUB
 1.0 Accessibility Specification



Automated Validation Systems

54% of publishers surveyed are using or plan to use (in the near future) automated systems to assess accessibility

Ace by DAISY is being built into workflows



Manual Validation of EPUB Files

85% of publishers responding use manual validation
