Green Supply Chain Work Plan

BIC's green agenda is woven through all activities and work, however particular focus is directed through the <u>Green Supply Chain Work</u> plan. Using the **United Nations Sustainability Development Goals** as its framework, recent projects include:



ENVIRONMENTAL ACCREDITATION BADGES PROJECT

We researched all the sustainability accreditation badges and standards applicable to the book industry supply chain, and curated them into a **journey 'map'** from author to customer.



DESIGNED FOR RECYCLING

How best to progress to a situation where every book is automatically and **always designed with recycling in mind**.

Our work in this area also feeds into the Metadata Capabilities Directory (MCD), BIC Realtime and Industry Returns Initiative (IRI) - featured in more detail in our **BIC In Practice: Data** piece.

* The Association of Authors' Agents, the Booksellers Association, Book Industry Communication, the Independent Publishers Guild, the Publishers Association and the Society of Authors.




Benefits of BIC's Projects
